Social services aims to provide a high living standard, healthy and inclusive society with affordable and innovative service delivery for Sarawakians

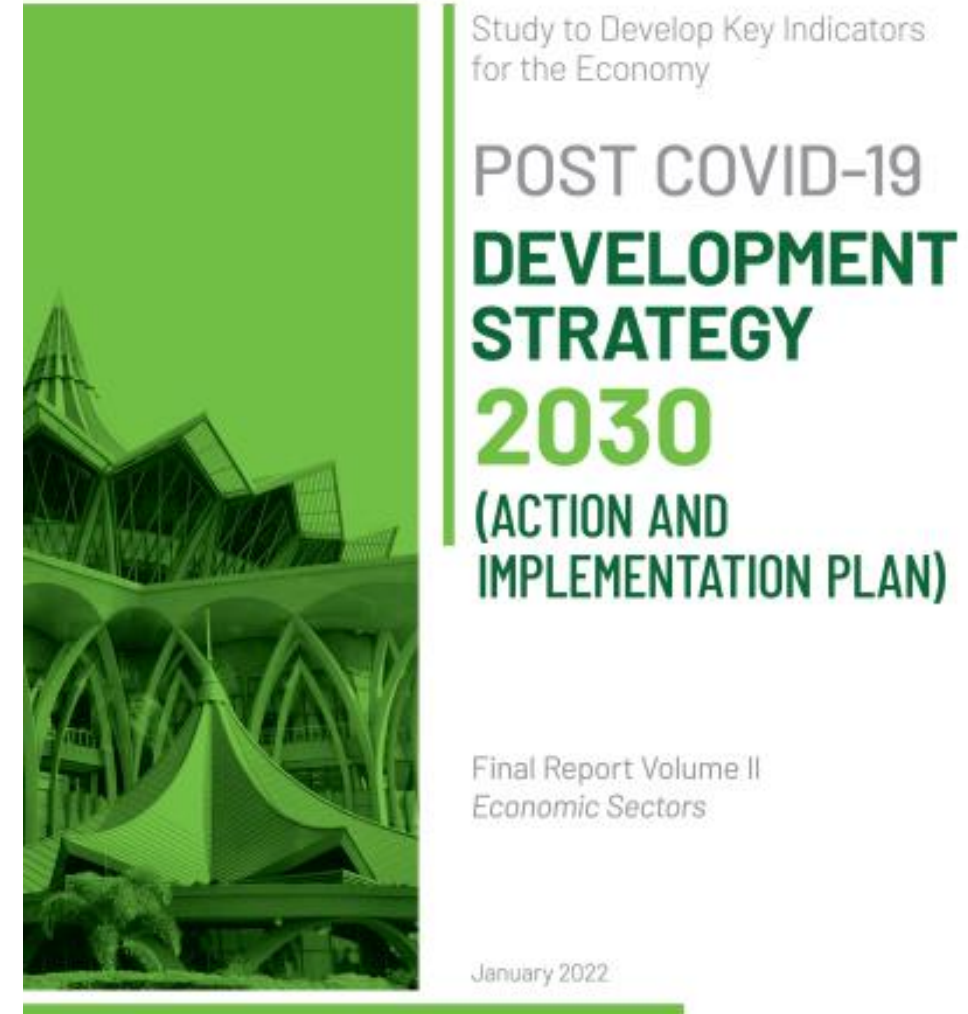
Key Outcomes



STRATEGY



- **Provide support to Sarawakians through housing assistance and healthcare schemes**
- **Assisting vulnerable groups (e.g. people with special needs, older persons, groups affected by social issues, etc.) through social support, intervention and shelter initiatives**



Score of 8.0 and above on the Sarawak Social Wellbeing Index and the Malaysian Family Wellbeing Index by 2030

- **SSWI 2019 – Moderate (score of 6.21)**
- **10 pillars, 25 social domains, 79 sub-social domains**
- **Social space and infrastructure is lowest (low score)**
- **Environmental sustainability is third lowest (moderate score)**

- **SSWI 2013 has started in July 2023**
- **Will complete in March 2024**

- **Will complete in February 2025**



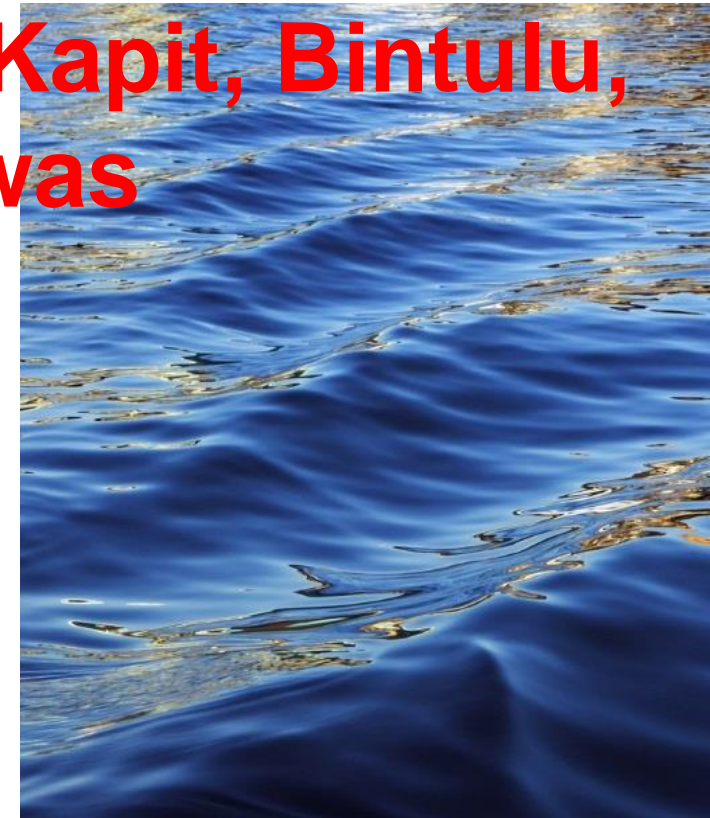
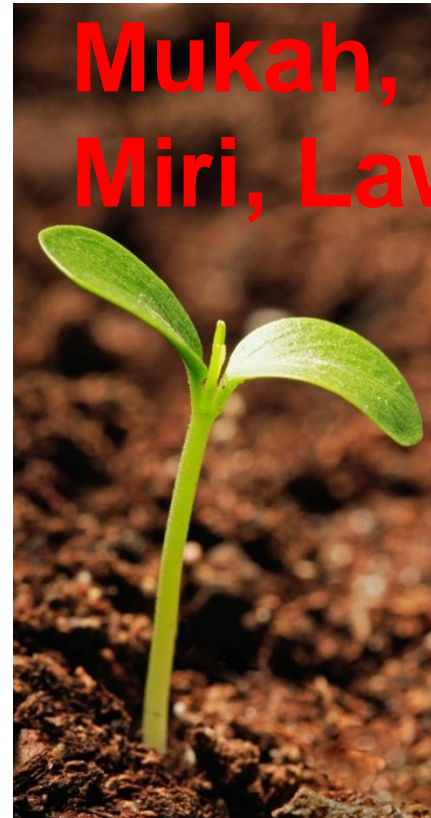

COMMUNITY SOCIAL SUPPORT CENTRE (CSSC)

A social transformation facilities to provide social support and intervention referrals for groups affected by social issues.

- The prevalence of social issues in Sarawak for the last 3 years is alarming:
 1. Drug and Substances Abuse – 21,211 arrested for drug use (2019 -2021)
 2. Petty Crimes – 15,630 cases (2019-2021)
 3. Teenage pregnancy – 6,250 cases (2019-2021)
 4. Domestic violence – 1,584 cases (2019-2021)
 5. Sexual crimes – 789 cases (2019-2021)
 6. Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) – 6,335 cases (2019-2021)
 7. Mental Health – 35.8% prevalence (2018); acute cases – 166,515 (2019 – September 2022)
 8. Suicide – 193 cases (2019-2021)
 9. Homeless – 233 cases (2019)
 10. Divorce – 8,448 cases (2019-2021)
 11. Personal identification issues – 8,714 registered by community leaders (2022)
 12. Drop out among children below 18 years old – 1,002 cases (2019)
 13. Underage marriage – 1,763 (2019)
 14. Poverty – 23,000 absolute poverty (2022); 56,000 poor (2022)
- 57% prevalence of social issues is in the rural.
- Vulnerable communities are affected by stigma of the issues they are facing and need social support and intervention referrals through community-based treatment and intervention to reduce the ratio for non help-seeking and to increase the social function and productivity of vulnerable communities. Current ratio is 1:7. Out of 1 person getting intervention from competent agencies, 7 do not.

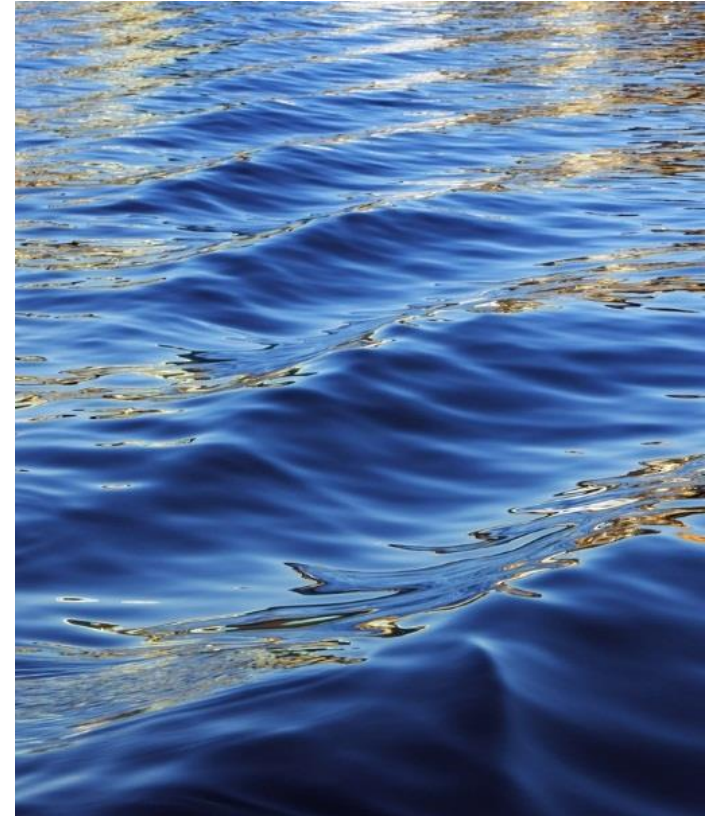

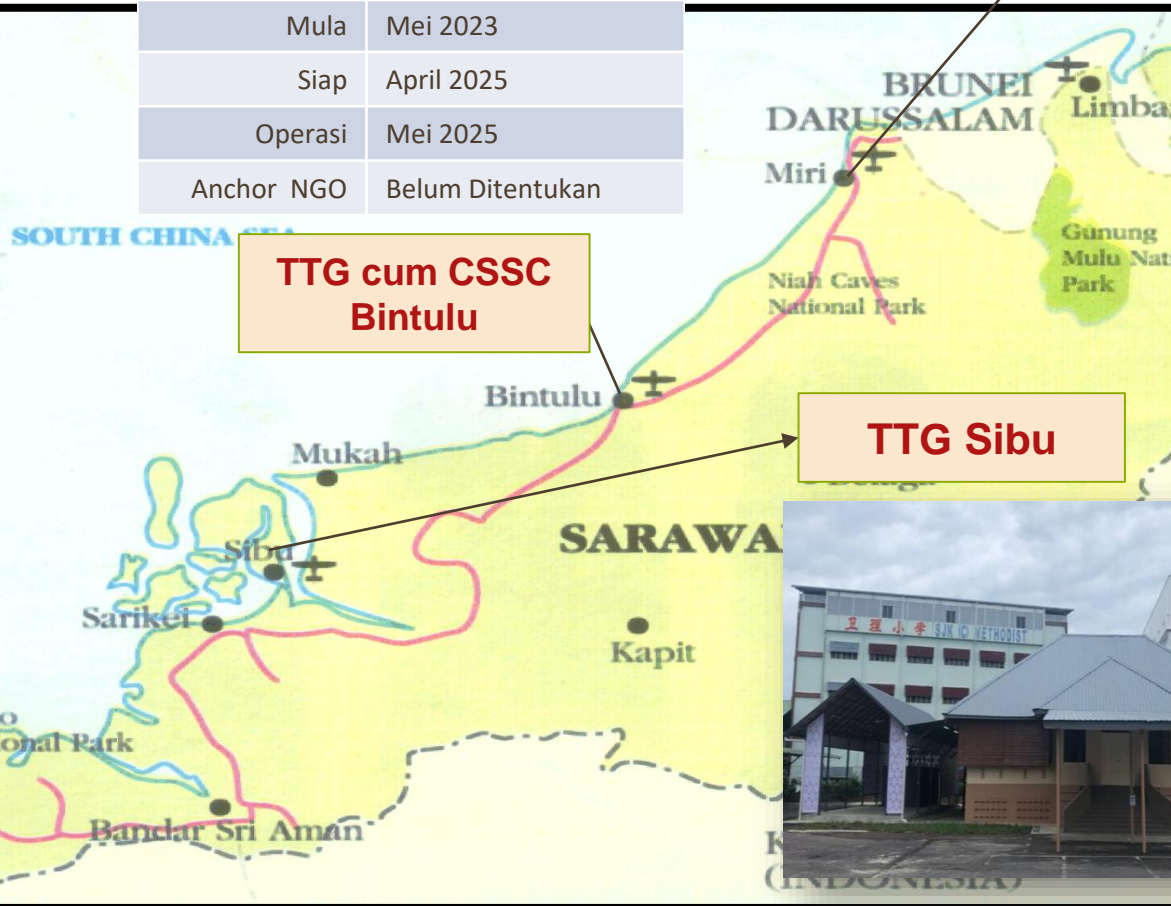

TEMPORARY SHELTERS FOR LOW INCOME RECOVERY COMMUNITY

Halfway homes for poor ex-convicts and stabilised individuals with mental health problems in major towns.

Temporary Shelter for Low Income Recovery Community:

Description: Provision of temporary shelters or halfway homes to place homeless and displaced persons from the recovery community (ex-convicts, recovery addicts, stabilized individuals with mental illness) without or rejected by family members.

Impact

- To reduce recidivism and relapse amongst homeless ex-convicts, recovery addicts, stabilized individuals with mental illness without or rejected by family members in Sarawak.
- An average of 300 hardcore poor and homeless ex-convicts and recovery addicts are released from prison and drugs rehabilitation institution monthly.
- An average of 100 hardcore poor and homeless individuals with mental illness who are already stabilized are released from psychiatric wards monthly.

INTEGRATED SARAWAK SOCIAL INTERVENTION PROGRAM AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT (ISIP)

Integrated social intervention programs conducted in collaboration with relevant social development agencies and NGOs to address targeted vulnerable groups.

- 1) **Integrated Teenage Pregnancy Intervention : Kesedaran dan Advokasi Pendidikan Seksual (KAPS) – Primary (Year 5 & 6) and Secondary School Children and dropouts below 18 years old**
- 2) **Integrated intervention program to address marriage and divorce issues in Sarawak – Pre-marital couples, married couples for 5 years and below, divorcees, de-facto marital status**
- 3) **Integrated Intervention for the safety and protection of vulnerable children and adolescents in Sarawak – primary school children, victims of sexual crimes, parents, teachers, guardians**
- 4) **Community Mental Health program – group affected by mental health issues and illness, carers, community developers, NGOs**
- 5) **Integrated Bullying of Child Intervention program – teachers, parents, wardens, guardians, primary and secondary schools, dormitory schools, victims, perpetrators**
- 6) **Integrated Intervention for domestic violence – perpetrators, victims, parents, vulnerable families, community leaders**
- 7) **Community Facilitator Intervention Competency – 50 selected community facilitators per district**
- 8) **Care for the Elderly Training for Carers – family members with elderly, guardians of elderly, NGOs, volunteers**

SPECIAL NEEDS COMMUNITY CENTRE (SNCC)

An integrated one stop early intervention facility to diagnose, provide intervention referrals, training and talent development for special needs groups in major towns.

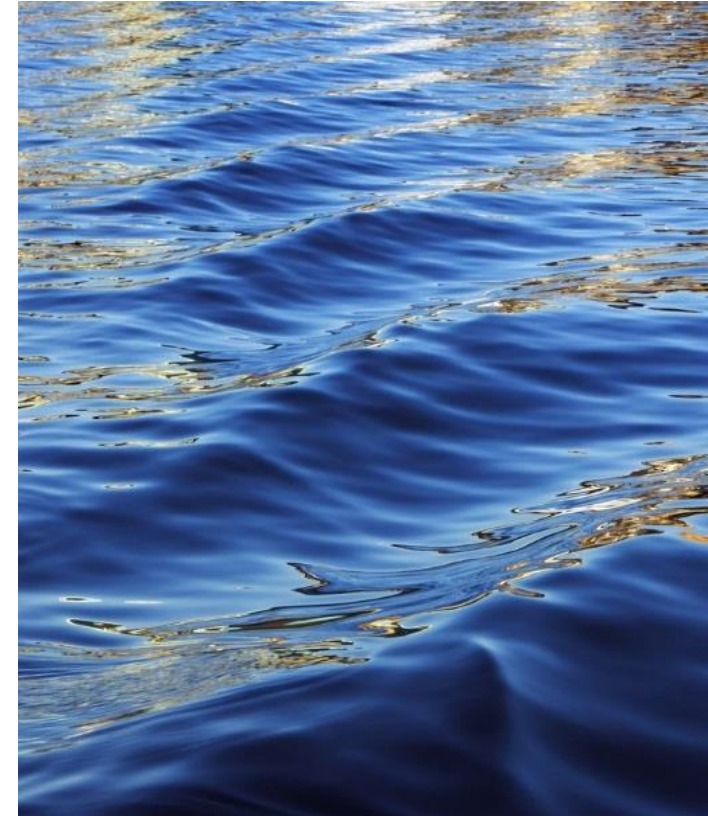

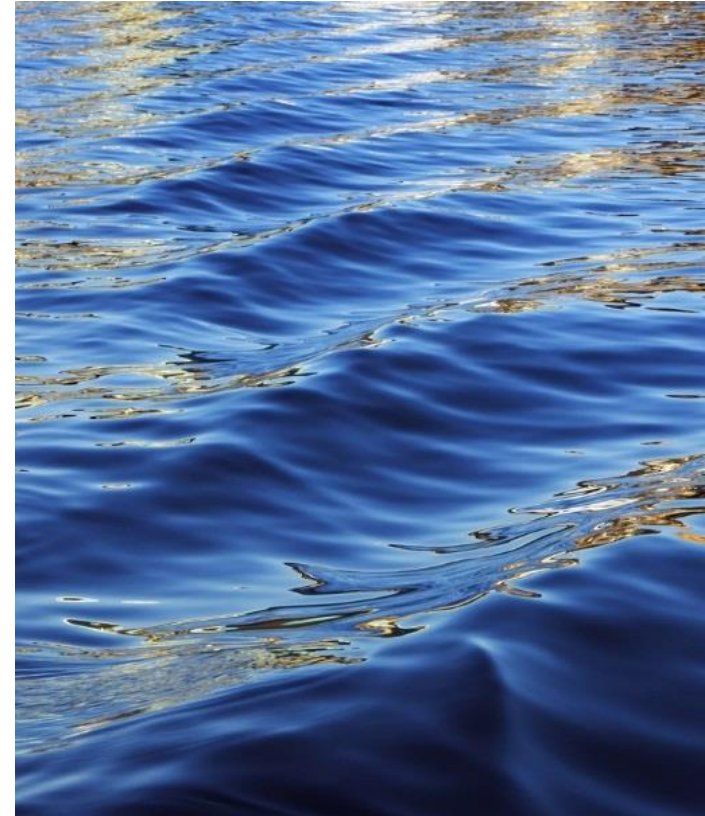

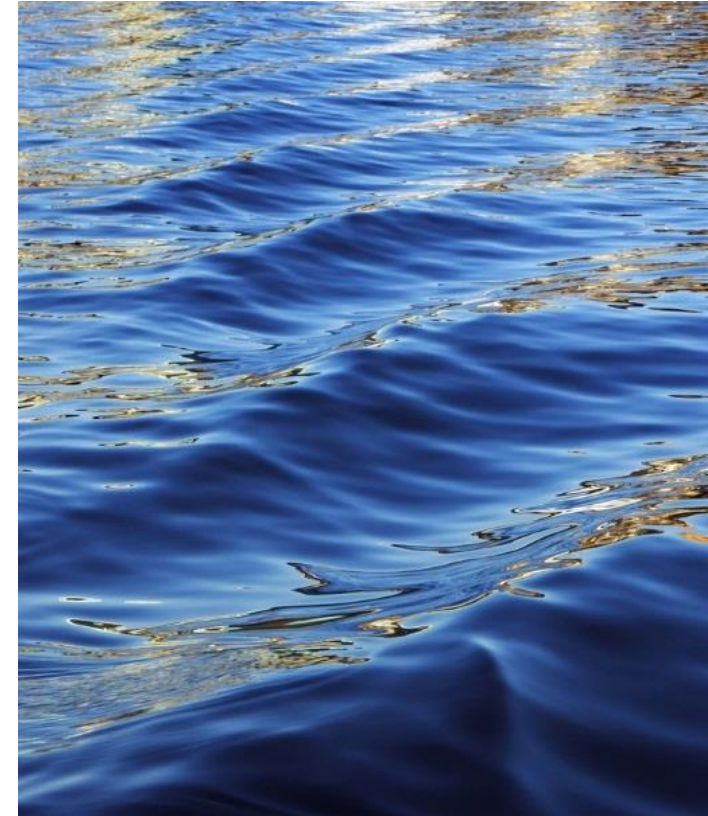
